Mark 1: 29-39

As soon as they left the synagogue, they entered the house of Simon and Andrew, with James and John. Now Simon's mother-in-law was in bed with a fever, and they told him about her at once. He came and took her by the hand and lifted her up. Then the fever left her, and she began to serve them.

That evening, at sundown, they brought to him all who were sick or possessed with demons. And the whole city was gathered around the door. And he cured many who were sick with various diseases, and cast out many demons; and he would not permit the demons to speak, because they knew him. In the morning, while it was still very dark, he got up and went out to a deserted place, and there he prayed. And Simon and his companions hunted for him. When they found him, they said to him, "Everyone is searching for you." He answered, "Let us go on to the neighboring towns, so that I may proclaim the message there also; for that is what I came out to do." And he went throughout Galilee, proclaiming the message in their synagogues and casting out demons.

ITINERARY Forest Hill Church Pilgrimage to Israel / Palestine

Friday – Saturday, Feb. 6 - 7 Leave Cleveland 7:02 p.m. to Tel Aviv via Newark – arrive Tel Aviv 4:30 p.m. Feb. 7

Sun. Feb. 8 Morning presentation with leaders at NSWS about history of Israel and the hopes / dreams / challenges of local populations for the future. Leave around mid-day for Caesarea Maritima for a visit to the site. Continue to Galilee.

Mon. Feb. 9 Morning visit to the Ginosar museum (the "Jesus Boat"). If weather is good, take a boat ride on the Sea of Galilee to Capernaum. Visit the archaeological site there and then continue to the Mount of Beatitudes for a visit.

Lunch at Tabhka (site of the multiplication of the loaves and fishes).

Travel north to Safed to visit the city (historic synagogues associated with the Kabbala and artist colony).

Tue. Feb. 10 Travel to Tel Megiddo (visit the archaeological site there). Continue with a visit to Nazareth and the Basilica of the Annunciation.

Wed. Feb. 11 Travel to Yardenit for a Baptismal

Travel to Beit She'an (visit the large archaeological site there).

Drive south to Jerusalem. Stop for panoramic view of the Old City at the Mount of Olives. Include a visit to the Israel Museum (to see the model of the Old City during the 1st century).

- **Thu. Feb. 12** Visit Temple Mount (Haram Es-Sharif), Western Wall, the Davidson Archaeological Complex and the City of David Complex.
- **Fri. Feb. 13** Visit the Upper Room/King David's Tomb, St. Peter in Gallicantu (Caiphas' house), Garden of Gethsemane, St. Anne's and the Pools of Bethesda, Via Dolorosa and the Church of the Holy Sepulcher.
- Sat. Feb. 14 Day excursion to Qumran and Masada.
- **Sun. Feb. 15** Day in Bethlehem. Visit the Basilica of the Nativity.
- **Mon. Feb. 16** Day at leisure in Jerusalem without the services of a guide or motor coach. Return to Cleveland on 11:40 p.m. flight; arrive 8 a.m. Tuesday.
