# ONE GREAT HOUR OF SHARING



The **ONE GREAT HOUR OF SHARING** Lenten offering supports projects in far-off lands – and just down the road.

Council Gardens is a senior independent living community on North Taylor Road in Cleveland Heights, Ohio, sponsored by the National Council of Jewish Women. Its culturally and ethnically diverse lower-income residents include native Clevelanders, African Americans born in the South, Asian immigrants, and many refugees from the former Soviet Union.

When the community Tenants Association sought a way to help senior residents stay active and be more self-sufficient, they came up with plans for a Community Garden that would be accessible even for those residents with physical disabilities. Tenants could grow fresh vegetables and fruits in season, improving their diets at minimal cost, as well as gaining the real satisfaction of providing for a basic need in their own lives. Many tenants had grown up farming and embraced the plan.

The Council Gardens Tenants Association applied to Presbytery of the Western Reserve's *Self-Development of People* program for support of their project. The Presbytery committee made a small grant toward the overall garden project at the site. The Council Gardens Tenant Association garden project has grown to include extensive covered areas for starting tender plants, collective gardens tilled by the more ambitious,

raised beds convenient for the disabled, fruit trees already beginning to bear. Next stages include terraces for berry bushes, building a high tunnel greenhouse, and holding weekly farmers' markets.

The residents of Council Gardens are taking responsibility for a portion of their nutritional needs while enriching their lives.

*Self-Development of People*, one of three Presbyterian Church (USA) initiatives funded from the One Great Hour of Sharing Lenten offering, assists groups of lower income people to take charge of their lives through grass-roots projects of economic and social empowerment – overseas and in the USA.

**Self-Development of People** has supported access to clean water for poor communities in the Dominican Republic – and helped ex-offenders return to the labor market in Dayton.

**Presbyterian Disaster Assistance** responds to tragedies inflicted by nature – such as ice storms and flooding in parts of Ohio – or of human origin – most recently the suffering from war in Gaza.

The *Presbyterian Hunger Program* supports our Presbytery's mission partner, the Sisonke Masilwe Indlala campaign for land rights and sustainable agriculture in South Africa – and food pantries and education programs in Portsmouth and Cincinnati.

**ONE GREAT HOUR OF SHARING** has evolved since 1949 from a single program to aid war-torn Europe, to a multi-faceted effort to fulfill the vision of Matthew 25 for suffering people far away and close to home. Whatever the setting, your gift to **ONE GREAT HOUR OF SHARING** shows the love and justice of Jesus Christ to the world.

# **Jesus' Triumphal Entry into Jerusalem**

When they were approaching Jerusalem, at Bethphage and Bethany, near the Mount of Olives, he sent two of his disciples and said to them, 'Go into the village ahead of you, and immediately as you enter it, you will find tied there a colt that has never been ridden; untie it and bring it. If anyone says to you, "Why are you doing this?" just say this, "The Lord needs it and will send it back here immediately." 'They went away and found a colt tied near a door, outside in the street. As they were untying it, some of the bystanders said to them, 'What are you doing, untying the colt?' They told them what Jesus had said; and they allowed them to take it. Then they brought the colt to Jesus and threw their cloaks on it; and he sat on it. Many people spread their cloaks on the road, and others spread leafy branches that they had cut in the fields. Then those who went ahead and those who followed were shouting,

'Hosanna!

Blessed is the one who comes in the name of the Lord! Blessed is the coming kingdom of our ancestor David! Hosanna in the highest heaven!'

Then he entered Jerusalem and went into the temple; and when he had looked around at everything, as it was already late, he went out to Bethany with the twelve.
