How can you assist with the **InterAct Cleveland 2010 Homeless Stand Down**, which serves over 2,000 homeless men and women with warm clothing, hot meals, health checks and good cheer?

Volunteer to work at one of the three all-day events at the Cleveland Convention Center. Several Forest Hill Church members will volunteer on <u>Sunday</u>, February 28th. Other events are scheduled on February 7th and March 5th. Volunteers help with greeting, guest conversations, food support, distribution of clothing and care kits, as well as pre- and post-event tasks.

You must send in a volunteer application and attend a pre-event training session prior to the event you choose. Trainings will be held at Pilgrim UCC Church, 2592 W. 14th Street on Monday Jan. 25th at 6PM or Saturday Jan. 30th at 10AM; or at Calvary Presbyterian Church, E. 79th & Euclid on Tuesday Feb. 16th at 6PM or Saturday Feb. 20th. <u>Contribute a personal care kit</u> with hygiene products vital to helping men and women renew and maintain good overall health. Pack a one gallon ziploc plastic bag with small sizes of:

liquid soap shampoo lotion toothbrush & toothpaste lip balm deodorant wash cloth razor & shaving cream (for men) maxi pads and/or tampons (for women)

Mark bags "M" or "F" whether for men or women. We most appreciate it if you can make up a complete personal care kit.

Please bring personal care kits to the stage in Fellowship Hall by <u>Sunday</u>, January 31, and the Ministry of Justice & Mission will deliver them to InterAct Cleveland.
