The Exterior Renovation Project

The building project is on budget and is substantially completed. All painting is complete. The work on the tile roof and gutters is complete. Five flat roofs will be replaced this week, weather permitting. McKnight & Associates, a landscape architect, has developed a master plan for the grounds. The first phase of the plan will be implemented this fall. The front third of the parking lot will be paved next spring.

From the PC(USA) 2007-2009 Book of Order

G-5.0100 The Meaning of Membership

- a. The incarnation of God in the life, death, and resurrection of Jesus Christ gives to the church not only its mission but also itsunderstanding of membership. One becomes an active member of the church through faith in Jesus Christ as Savior and acceptance of his Lordship in all of life. Baptism and a public profession of faith in Jesus as Lord are the visible signs of entrance into the active membership of the church.
- b. Persons may enter into active church membership in the following ways: by profession of faith, reaffirmation of faith in Jesus Christ, or transfer of certificate from some other church.
- c. When persons baptized as infants reach an age when they are ready to make public their profession of faith and accept their responsibility in the life of the church, the session should invite, encourage, and help them prepare for their responsibility as active church members.
