The Acts of the Apostles Bible study challenge has ended, and I feel a little sad. Nine weeks of studying the book of Acts, praying the book of Acts, creating art in response to the book of Acts, hearing sermons from Acts, AND for those who took the Bible Basics class, learning about the basics of the Scriptures themselves, proved to be a *wildly* successful nine-week experience for our congregation. It was powerful to be on the same page as a large group week after week! Is there anything better than hearing casual conversations taking place between parishioners with donuts in hand after church discussing the early church and its mission?!



ONE GREAT HOUR OF SHARING

The One Great Hour of Sharing is the Presbyterian Church (USA)'s annual Lenten offering for the work of church mission agencies with the poor, hungry, and destitute in this country and around the world. It supports:

- Presbyterian Disaster Assistance, which intervened in high profile overseas tragedies in Haiti and Pakistan last year, and has assisted people driven from their homes by flooding in Findlay, OH. It also is the church agency that cares for refugees from war and oppression.
- Presbyterian Hunger Program, which provides funding and educational materials around issues of food justice in such places as South Africa (in partnership with the SAMP project of our Presbytery) and South Florida, where the field workers who pick our lettuce and strawberries are perennially underpaid.
- Self-Development of People, which awards grants to grass-roots community enterprises organized by groups of mostly poor people in the U.S.A., including in the Cleveland area -- \$1 out of every \$6 given in our Presbytery returns here to support projects like the EcoVillage Produce market garden on Cleveland's Near West Side.

Do you know that is what we are (becoming)? The Environmental Ministries department of PC(USA) has created a program whereby individual churches can become a designated Earth Care Congregation. This is an ongoing program, and after initial certification, a program of 'continuous improvement' in 'sustainability' is necessary for annual re-certification. Congregations are evaluated in four major categories with regards to actions taken in Worship, Education, Facilities, and Outreach which specifically target how we are caring for God's creation. Congregations who achieve such status can be proud of this recognition which will be broadcast not only within the Presbytery but within our local communities through advertising, and by incorporating it into our logos and the FHC letterhead. This is a great attraction for gaining new members as well as a 'charge' for all of us in our daily lives!

But why should we care? Because it is our duty as God's children to care for His creation which he has left to our safekeeping. We have formed an Earth Care Team (formerly the Green team), conducted a fairly comprehensive energy/facilities audit with an outside consulting firm, completed a self-evaluation survey in the above four categories, and met with the FHC staff for discussion. A presentation has been made to Session and they have completed a Pledge, all part of our application process to become an Earth Care Congregation.

By the time you read this, we hope to celebrate that we are indeed named an Earth Care Congregation – and our continued actions to support that will just be beginning! We will be laying the groundwork for how we as a church family – and also how we as individual families – can become even more proactive in caring for our home, local, and global environments. Stay tuned, and we welcome any new folks to the Earth Care Team if you are interested!
