October 28 "Is the American government for sale?" Jerry Graham, speaker

The amount of money spent on our political campaigns has grown exponentially in the past two decades. This year we are going to spend perhaps 2 billion dollars on ads, the money for which was provided through largely anonymous sources and are overwhelmingly negative attacks on the opponent. We are the outliers of the world in terms of these expenditures, their lack of regulation and the length of our campaigns. Does this represent a danger to our democratic system? If so, what, if anything, can be done to reduce the influence of moneyed interests in the American political system?

Jerry Graham taught for a few years as an Instructor in Political Science at Wittenberg University (Springfield, Ohio), then for 32 years at Shaker Heights HS. Since retiring from there, Mr. Graham has been teaching in the adult ed programs of CWRU, CCC, the Jewish Community Center and Menorah Park.

November 4 "What is the future of Faith and American Politics?" A conversation with a multi-religious panel of young adult students—Muslim, Christian, Jewish, Sikh, and non-religious—from CWRU. Are young adults interested in politics, religion and the issues for the world they are living in today and the future they will be creating? Come and hear these bright and insightful voices of young voters.
