## ■■■ The Lessons

Today's Scripture: Romans 13: 1-10

Let every person be subject to the governing authorities; for there is no authority except from God, and those authorities that exist have been instituted by God. Therefore whoever resists authority resists what God has appointed, and those who resist will incur judgment. For rulers are not a terror to good conduct, but to bad. Do you wish to have no fear of the authority? Then do what is good, and you will receive its approval; for it is God's servant for your good. But if you do what is wrong, you should be afraid, for the authority does not bear the sword in vain! It is the servant of God to execute wrath on the wrongdoer. Therefore one must be subject, not only because of wrath but also because of conscience. For the same reason you also pay taxes, for the authorities are God's servants, busy with this very thing.

Pay to all what is due them—taxes to whom taxes are due, revenue to whom revenue is due, respect to whom respect is due, honor to whom honor is due. Owe no one anything, except to love one another; for the one who loves another has fulfilled the law. The commandments, "You shall not commit adultery; You shall not murder; You shall not steal; You shall not covet"; and any other commandment, are summed up in this word, "Love your neighbor as yourself." Love does no wrong to a neighbor; therefore, love is the fulfilling of the law.

**Next Sunday**: **Romans 14: 1-9, 17-19** As part of your daily devotions, read the lesson. What image or word catches your attention? How do they settle or challenge you? Keep notes of your observations in a journal. Set aside part of each day for prayer and study.

# Charlise Lyles, author of Do I Dare Disturb the Universe? November 18, 12:15 pm. South Hall, Forest Hill Church

Author Charlise Lyles will share her personal story of socioeconomic uplift, as well as her thoughts on what we as individuals can do to make a significant difference in the life of a child. Ms. Lyles will be available for questions as well as to autograph her book which will be available for purchase Everyone is invited and welcome.

Charlise Lyles was born in Cleveland in 1959, was among the first girls to enter Hawken School as a tenth grader when it became coed in 1974, and is a 1981 graduate of Smith College. She is a novelist and a poet. She has worked as a clerk to the New York Times chief White House correspondent, and as a reporter for two newspapers in Virginia and the Dayton Daily News. She was the recipient of three awards from the Ohio Society of Professional Journalists. She lives in Atlanta, Georgia, and visits Cleveland regularly to see family.

Here is a brief description of the book, **Do I Dare Disturb the Universe: From the Projects to Prep School:** 

A memoir of race and education, this is the story of a girl who grew up and out of the Cleveland projects in the 1960s and '70s.



While growing up in Cleveland, young Charlise Lyles experienced turbulent events including race riots and a neighborhood murder. Yet she was inspired to appreciate literature at a young age, and she spent her days reading—and also often searching for the estranged father who taught her that love of learning.

Despite starting in the "slow class" at an aging school on Cleveland's east side, Lyles had a thirst for knowledge and drive for success that would open a door to new opportunities. Granted a scholarship to a

prestigious prep school in a wealthy suburb, the vibrant teenager finds herself presented with a bewildering set of new challenges—and a new direction in life.
