#### Be Alive

YOU ARE SEEING everything for the last time, and everything you see is gilded with goodbyes. The child's hand like a starfish on the pillow, your hand on the doorknob. Caught between screen and window, a wasp unfolds one wing. With a sick smile, guilt-ridden, the old dachshund lurches off the forbidden couch when you come through the door, his nose dry with sleep, and makes for the pillow by the hot-air register. It is the room where for years Christmases have happened, snow falling so thick by the window that sometimes it has started to snow in the room, brightness falling on tables, books, chairs, the gaudy tree in the corner, a family sitting there snowmen, snowbound, snowblind to the crazy passing of what they think will never pass. And today now everything will pass because it is the last day. For the last time you are seeing this rain fall and in your mind that snow, this child asleep, this cat. For the last time you are hearing this house come alive because you who are part of its life have come alive. All the unkept promises if they are ever to be kept have to be kept today. All the unspoken words if you do not speak them today will never be spoken. The people, the ones you love and the ones who bore you to death, all the life you have in you to live with them, if you do not live it with them today will never be lived.

It is the first day because it has never been before and the last day because it will never be again. Be alive if you can all through this day today of your life. What's to be done? What's to be done?

Follow your feet. Put on the coffee. Start the orange juice, the bacon, the toast. Then go wake up your children and your wife. Think about the work of your hands, the book that of all conceivable things you have chosen to add to the world's pain. Live in the needs of the day.

- 4. Why did God ask Ezekiel to eat the scroll?



# Join us in ending injustices in our region. YOU ARE INVITED TO PARTICIPATE IN THE GREATER CLEVELAND CONGREGATIONS (GCC)

GCC is a non-partisan coalition of faith communities and partner organizations in Cuyahoga County working together to build power for social justice.

GCC is comprised of 40 religious congregations, Christian and Jewish as well as other faith traditions, in the city and suburbs.

We at Forest Hill Church have a strong and vibrant commitment to mission and justice with many service projects in the community, particularly concerning racism, homelessness, hunger, education, and the environment. We have branched out into health, with the health fair this year, and getting new understanding of criminal justice concerns as well as gun control. GCC has been active over the last 2 plus years in these and related areas, making significant inroads in Cleveland Municipal Schools (education team) and Medicaid expansion(health team), as well as addressing both gun control and racism in the criminal justice system (criminal justice team). Thus, when John and Deanne introduced the idea of FHC joining GCC, five of us volunteered to be the first on the "Core Team": Diana Woodbridge, Sharon Shumaker, Dick Obermanns, Mark Chupp, and Jennifer Blakeney. We have since added several more core team members, including Gretchen Reynolds and Ed Gemerchak, since Session approved our membership in GCC.

FHC, in joining Greater Cleveland Congregations, has an added opportunity to make a difference in the lives of those we are called to help by striving to change the structures that maintain injustice. We gain power and effectiveness when we work with our brothers and sisters in faith combined with the experience of trained staff at GCC.

The FHC Core Team is the liaison between the congregation and GCC, allowing us to engage in the activities of GCC and have our input into the organization. We are looking to expand the Core Team and invite anyone who wishes to join us. You have the opportunity to be involved at a variety of levels: become a member of one of the three issue teams (see italics above) or simply participate in the various actions and gatherings to support the work. Many of you can expect to hear from us as we seek to discover, through individual conversations, where our collective hopes and dreams and deepest convictions rest.

Contact any of the Core Team members listed above for more information or to express your interest in attending activities or joining the Core Team.

On December 12, there will be an important and exhilerating meeting/assembly to learn of the successes and to participate in the next steps of GCC. These are very well organized and energizing and we hope FHC will attend in large numbers to show our support. More information will follow. Stay tuned!
