



#### **FHC Cultural Immersion Trip to Haiti**

Have you ever thought about traveling to a developing country like Haiti? You probably have some questions. Are there things I could do? Is there a good place to stay? Is it safe? Can I really make a difference? The answer to all these is "yes".

FHC in partnership with Haiti Outreach is planning a trip to Haiti for February 11 thru February 19, 2015. Haiti Outreach's vision is that Haiti become a developed country with clean water and sanitization, sufficient food, available medical care, and educational and economic opportunities. In fact it is through this partnership and our congregation's generosity that a well is under construction in Gabo, a remote village in the Central Plateau of Haiti. Our mission is to continue to play a part in this development by not only supporting projects financially but to build a long-term sustainable relationship with the people of Haiti through annual trips.

Our trip promises to be simple, comfortable, and fulfilling. We will leave Cleveland the morning of February 11 and arrive in Port-au-Prince that afternoon. During the week we will learn the history of Haiti and the work of Haiti Outreach, tour Pignon, visit a rum distillery and other community businesses. We will experience market day, and visit a hospital, an orphanage, and a school. On Sunday we will attend one of the local churches to experience an important part of Haitian culture. We hope to visit Gabo to see the well that FHC funded and meet their community leaders. For those who are able and interested, a work project may also be planned. An added bonus to our trip is that during this time we will participate in the three-day celebration of Mardi Gras. We will return to Cleveland on February 19 via Miami.

Join us for this life-altering trip. Although the itinerary has not been finalized, we promise you an experience that you will never forget. The cost of the trip per person is estimated to be \$1600 to \$2000 (airfare dependent) which will cover all of your transportation, lodging, and most of your meals. The only additional costs would be for souvenirs, a couple of meals, and possibly for side trips.

#### The Lessons

#### Isaiah 40: 1-11

Comfort, O comfort my people, says your God. Speak tenderly to Jerusalem, and cry to her that she has served her term, that her penalty is paid, that she has received from the Lord's hand double for all her sins.

A voice cries out: "In the wilderness prepare the way of the LORD, make straight in the desert a highway for our God. Every valley shall be lifted up, and every mountain and hill be made low; the uneven ground shall become level, and the rough places a plain. Then the glory of the LORD shall be revealed, and all people shall see it together, for the mouth of the LORD has spoken." A voice says, "Cry out!" And I said, "What shall I cry?" All people are grass, their constancy is like the flower of the field. The grass withers, the flower fades, when the breath of the LORD blows upon it; surely the people are grass. The grass withers, the flower fades; but the word of our God will stand forever.

Get you up to a high mountain, O Zion, herald of good tidings; lift up your voice with strength, O Jerusalem, herald of good tidings, lift it up, do not fear; say to the cities of Judah, "Here is your God!" See, the Lord God comes with might, and his arm rules for him; his reward is with him, and his recompense before him. He will feed his flock like a shepherd; he will gather the lambs in his arms, and carry them in his bosom, and gently lead the mother sheep.

#### Mark 1: 1-8

The beginning of the good news of Jesus Christ, the Son of God.

As it is written in the prophet Isaiah,

"See, I am sending my messenger ahead of you, who will prepare your way; the voice of one crying out in the wilderness: 'Prepare the way of the Lord, make his paths straight,'"

John the baptizer appeared in the wilderness, proclaiming a baptism of repentance for the forgiveness of sins. And people from the whole Judean countryside and all the people of Jerusalem were going out to him, and were baptized by him in the river Jordan, confessing their sins. Now John was clothed with camel's hair, with a leather belt around his waist, and he ate locusts and wild honey. He proclaimed, "The one who is more powerful than I is coming after me; I am not worthy to stoop down and untie the thong of his sandals. I have baptized you with water; but he will baptize you with the Holy Spirit."
