



Forest Hill Church and Refugee Assistance

When we pray for the Lord to provide, the answer often is an opportunity to do God's own work. Just such an opportunity has presented itself.

Many of you have met Danielle Drake of US Together, a non-profit that assists recently arrived refugee families manage the challenge of moving to our community from foreign lands and already chaotic circumstances. The congregation has generously supported US Together's work financially, and we have discussed options for helping our new neighbors.

And now the next step has presented itself: Danielle has informed us that a single mother and her 14 year old son, both refugees from Afghanistan, are arriving in the next two weeks and require a place to stay for about a month as US Together puts together a residence plan. The timing is amazing: two people far from their homes are looking for room at the Inn. Familiar, no? We understand that this is a busy time of year and that many of us simply cannot accommodate more people in their home. I'm sure there will be other ways to help our new friends once they're here. But it would be a blessing if, somehow, someone is able to make space for these guests.

King James Version

And Mary said, My soul doth magnify the Lord, And my spirit hath rejoiced in God my Saviour. For he hath regarded the low estate of his handmaiden: for, behold, from henceforth all generations shall call me blessed. For he that is mighty hath done to me great things; and holy is his name. And his mercy is on them that fear him from generation to generation. He hath shewed strength with his arm; he hath scattered the proud in the imagination of their hearts. He hath put down the mighty from their seats, and exalted them of low degree. He hath filled the hungry with good things; and the rich he hath sent empty away. He hath holpen his servant Israel, in remembrance of his mercy; As he spake to our fathers, to Abraham, and to his seed for ever.

New International Version

And Mary said: "My soul glorifies the Lord, and my spirit rejoices in God my Savior, for he has been mindful of the humble state of his servant. From now on all generations will call me blessed, for the Mighty One has done great things for me— holy is his name. His mercy extends to those who fear him, from generation to generation. He has performed mighty deeds with his arm; he has scattered those who are proud in their inmost thoughts. He has brought down rulers from their thrones but has lifted up the humble. He has filled the hungry with good things but has sent the rich away empty. He has helped his servant Israel, remembering to be merciful to Abraham and his descendants forever, just as he promised our ancestors."

God's Word Translation
