

#### Forest Hill Church Black History Month 2017 Eat at a Black-Owned Restaurant Weekend February 10-12, 2017

**GOALS -** The major goals of the Forest Hill Church's "Eat at a Black-owned Restaurant Weekend" are to:

- Encourage members to intentionally support local Black-owned businesses as an expression of financial justice
- Expose members to places where the hospitality of African American Culture is expressed through welcome and good food

#### BACKGROUND - Did you know:

- The number of Black-owned businesses in the U.S. increased by **61%** between 2002-2007, and another **34.5%** between 2007-2012 <u>during the recession</u>!
- The number of businesses owned by Black women has increased by an astonishing 322% since 1997
- Black-owned and operated businesses are located all over northeast Ohio, providing a wide variety of goods and services, from retail stores to gas stations, from social services lawn services, from electronic repairs to restaurants.
- One of the best ways to help Black families achieve financial stability is to spend money at Black-owned businesses for products and services you needed anyway
- Cleveland is home to Real Black Friday, which maintains a directory of Black-owned businesses in Cleveland and encourages everyone to support them. See: <u>http://therealblackfriday.com/</u>

#### **REFLECT – We invite you to reflect on your experience**

- Have you thought before of intentionally supporting Black-owned businesses? Why
  or why not?
- What might be some barriers for you to regularly supporting Black-owned businesses?
- Did your trip to the restaurant bring you to a neighborhood that is "off your beaten path?" If so, how did that make you feel?
- How does this dining experience compare to what you are accustomed to when dining out? What is similar? What is different?
- Has this outing made a difference in your willingness to patronize Black-owned businesses without a special occasion?
- Will you encourage your other non-black friends/family to patronize Black owned restaurants and other Black-owned businesses?
