



Scripture Lessons

Genesis 1: 1-5, 2: 1-4a

In the beginning when God created the heavens and the earth, the earth was a formless void and darkness covered the face of the deep, while a wind from God swept over the face of the waters.

Then God said, "Let there be light"; and there was light. And God saw that the light was good; and God separated the light from the darkness. God called the light Day, and the darkness he called Night. And there was evening and there was morning, the first day.



Letter-writing Campaign: Roz Peters will be in the Fellowship Hall organizing a letter-writing campaign to Senators Rob Portman and Sherrod Brown to protect Medicare in Ohio.

As many of you know, Ohio Senator Rob Portman is one of thirteen senators on the committee that is drafting changes to the AHCA. Right now, drastic cuts to Medicaid are a significant concern.

Medicaid enables close to 2.65 million Ohioans to access quality health care. Nearly 40 percent of all children in Ohio are on Medicaid. Medicaid covers populations our scriptures and faith traditions call on us to prioritize and care for: low-income children, seniors, and people with disabilities. Through the Medicaid expansion, nearly 700,000 low-income individuals in Ohio have gained access to quality, affordable coverage.
