



#### **Scripture Lessons**

Isaiah 40: 1-11

Comfort, O comfort my people, says your God. Speak tenderly to Jerusalem, and cry to her that she has served her term, that her penalty is paid, that she has received from the Lord's hand double for all her sins.

A voice cries out: "In the wilderness prepare the way of the LORD, make straight in the desert a highway for our God. Every valley shall be lifted up, and every mountain and hill be made low; the uneven ground shall become level, and the rough places a plain. Then the glory of the LORD shall be revealed, and all people shall see it together, for the mouth of the LORD has spoken." A voice says, "Cry out!" And I said, "What shall I cry?" All people are grass, their constancy is like the flower of the field. The grass withers, the flower fades, when the breath of the LORD blows upon it; surely the people are grass. The grass withers, the flower fades; but the word of our God will stand forever.

Get you up to a high mountain, O Zion, herald of good tidings; lift up your voice with strength, O Jerusalem, herald of good tidings, lift it up, do not fear; say to the cities of Judah, "Here is your God!" See, the Lord God comes with might, and his arm rules for him; his reward is with him, and his recompense before him. He will feed his flock like a shepherd; he will

gather the lambs in his arms, and carry them in his bosom, and gently lead the mother sheep.

#### Mark 1: 1-8

The beginning of the good news of Jesus Christ, the Son of God.

As it is written in the prophet Isaiah,

"See, I am sending my messenger ahead of you, who will prepare your way; the voice of one crying out in the wilderness: 'Prepare the way of the Lord, make his paths straight,'"

John the baptizer appeared in the wilderness, proclaiming a baptism of repentance for the forgiveness of sins. And people from the whole Judean countryside and all the people of Jerusalem were going out to him, and were baptized by him in the river Jordan, confessing their sins. Now John was clothed with camel's hair, with a leather belt around his waist, and he ate locusts and wild honey. He proclaimed, "The one who is more powerful than I is coming after me; I am not worthy to stoop down and untie the thong of his sandals. I have baptized you with water; but he will baptize you with the Holy Spirit."



Dear friends,

During this season of faith, charity, and goodwill, many of our local immigrant families will spend the holidays in great fear and sadness, with an empty seat at their dinner tables. An ominous shift in our nation's policies has resulted in mothers and fathers being apprehended, detained, and deported, leaving children in anguish and families destroyed.

This holiday season we must reflect: What kind of country do we want America to be? Currently, agents of our broken immigration system are abducting, imprisoning, and deporting in record numbers law-abiding immigrants who have long worked in our fields and factories, purchased homes, paid their taxes, and raised their American-born children here. This does not represent our country or our values.

Esperanza, a married mother of four teenage U.S. citizen daughters, was recently deported after living in Painesville for over 20 years. She worked in a local factory full-time, but was known as a good cook and for the warm environment she created in her home every Sunday as people from far and wide came for her homemade tortillas and Mexican stews.

On Thanksgiving she was not home cooking for her family, but was miles away in a migrant shelter in Nuevo Laredo, Mexico, a dangerous border town where U.S. immigration officials secretively transported her in shackles, and dropped her alone at night with no money, no identification, and not even a call to her family or lawyer so that they could arrange for her safety. Meanwhile, her teenage daughters will be forced to cope without her. They are one example of countless families living through this nightmare.

For nearly two decades, HOLA has worked to protect and support our immigrant workers and their families. Through a combination of grassroots organizing, advocacy, education, and legal assistance, HOLA has won the release of mothers and fathers from unjust detentions, stopped their deportations, and helped put many on a path to legal status.

Your support is vital. These times are much more challenging. Please consider making a gift of \$50 or more to HOLA so we may continue working to ensure our country lives up to its values. During this season of giving, I give thanks for your support.
