There was a Levite, a native of Cyprus, Joseph, to whom the apostles gave the name Barnabas (which means 'son of encouragement'). He sold a field that belonged to him, then brought the money, and laid it at the apostles' feet.





From Awareness to Vigilance: Ideas about a Path to Achieving Racial Equity and Inclusion – in South Hall after worship

Rev. Lois Annich is away today, joining her husband and St. Paul's Episcopal Church as they celebrate Rich's ministry and retirement:

Rev. Richard Israel was ordained in April 1978. He was called by the (former) Inter-church Council of Greater Cleveland and Lutheran Metropolitan Ministry as a community organizer to help facilitate the peaceful implementation of the desegregation order in the Cleveland City Schools. As Executive Director of The Long Term Care Ombudsman program, then a program of Lutheran Metropolitan Ministry, he oversaw the work of a team of advocates for long term care patients and families. He served as Associate Director of Lutheran Chaplaincy Services, where he recruited, hired and supervised chaplains the agency placed in institutions throughout Northeast Ohio. He has served several congregations, and is finally retiring after 12 years from St. Paul's Episcopal Church, Cleveland Heights.
