**Kerygma study: The Book of Matthew:** Sign-up for the fall Kerygma classes begins August 5.

**Did you know?** *The word "kerygma" comes from the Greek word for "preaching." The Merriam-Webster Dictionary defines it as "the apostolic proclamation of salvation through Jesus Christ." In our context, Kerygma is a program developed by Cokesbury, a religious supply and publishing company, that "offers Bible Studies for groups to actively engage in learning about the complexities of the Bible in lively and interactive group*

*sessions.” Our classes are taught by lay leaders in groups of up to 20 participants.*
