



Scripture Lesson

Mark 10: 17-31

As he was setting out on a journey, a man ran up and knelt before him, and asked him, "Good Teacher, what must I do to inherit eternal life?" Jesus said to him, "Why do you call me good? No one is good but God alone. You know the commandments: 'You shall not murder; You shall not commit adultery; You shall not steal; You shall not bear false witness; You shall not defraud; Honor your father and mother.'" He said to him, "Teacher, I have kept all these since my youth." Jesus, looking at him, loved him and said, "You lack one thing; go, sell what you own, and give the money to the poor, and you will have treasure in heaven; then come, follow me." When he heard this, he was shocked and went away grieving, for he had many possessions.

Ned Edwards joined the Forest Hill staff as the Minister of Christian Education in the spring of 1963. In 1970, Senior Pastor Yoder Leith retired and Rev. Edwards resigned in order to be called as Senior Pastor. The months surrounding his election are described as "turbulent" – the church's inner turmoil reflected the changing world around it. Rev. Edwards wrote this hymn shortly after he became Senior Pastor and Forest Hill was embracing the social justice mission to which we continue to be committed. He retired in 1992; after an interim period John Lentz was elected Senior Pastor at the end of 1993.


