
Prayer of Confession







Another urgent need has been presented for a Nicaraguan man who has been held at NEOCC (North East Ohio Correctional Center) for six months. His asylum case is progressing but he was denied bond due to lack of community ties. The social worker who is preparing his psychological evaluation for his attorney wrote "His story is very tragic. His prolonged detention is unjust". As people continue to seek asylum this is a concrete way we can respond and make a difference.
