



Yet it also implies the gifts and graces of an ever-present God, who miraculously led a grieving and disoriented people through the wilderness to a new orientation. This is our objective: to support the journey from disorientation to reorientation. Register by Sunday, March 15.

Learning Objectives: Participants will engage in varied forms of grief work, including:

- Learning the fundamentals and complexities of grief and loss
- Engaging in biblically-based spiritual practices to support healing and restoration
- Exploring artistic expression through our art-making sanctuary

By now we've probably all seen reporting of the global outbreak of Coronavirus. There are now documented cases being reported in the United States. At the time of this writing, there are no known cases of COVID-19 in the state of Ohio. You can be assured that the Forest Hill Church Building Staff and SCT are closely monitoring the situation and taking recommended precautions in the daily maintenance and care of our facilities.

We ask members and visitors to follow these everyday preventive actions recommended by the CDC and Ohio Department of Health to help prevent the spread of COVID-19:

- If you are ill, staying home is best, except to get medical care.
- Cover your coughs and sneezes with a tissue, then throw the tissue in the trash.
- Wash your hands often with soap and water for at least 20 seconds, especially after going to the bathroom; before eating; and after blowing your nose, coughing, or sneezing.
- Avoid touching your eyes, nose, and mouth with unwashed hands.
