
PRAYER OF CONFESSION

Opening Our Hearts to God's Word THE LIVING WORD (NRSV) Isaiah 40:21-31

Have you not known? Have you not heard? Has it not been told you from the beginning? Have you not understood from the foundations of the earth? It is he who sits above the circle of the earth, and its inhabitants are like grasshoppers; who stretches out the heavens like a curtain, and spreads them like a tent to live in; who brings princes to naught, and makes the rulers of the earth as nothing. Scarcely are they planted, scarcely sown, scarcely has their stem taken root in the earth, when he blows upon them, and they wither, and the tempest carries them off like stubble. To whom then will you compare me, or who is my equal? Says the Holy One. Lift up your eyes on high and see: Who created these? He who brings out their host and numbers them, calling them all by name; because he is great in strength, mighty in power, not one is missing. Why do you say, O Jacob, and speak, O Israel, "My way is hidden from the Lord, and my right is disregarded by my God"? Have you not known? Have you not heard? Even youths will faint and be weary, and the young will fall exhausted; but those who wait for the Lord shall renew their strength, they shall mount up with wings like eagles, they shall run and not be weary, they shall walk and not faint.

Mark 1:29-39

As soon as they left the synagogue, they entered the house of Simon and Andrew, with James and John. Now Simon's mother-in-law was in bed with a fever, and they told him about her at once. He came and took her by the hand and lifted her up. Then the fever left her, and she began to serve them. That evening, at sundown, they brought to him all who were sick or possessed with demons. And the whole city was gathered around the door. And he cured many who were sick with various diseases, and cast out many demons; and he would not permit the demons to speak, because they knew him. In the morning, while it was still very dark, he got up and went out to a deserted place, and there he prayed. And Simon and his companions hunted for him. The music ministry is excited to celebrate Black History Month and will present music written by composers of African descent in services. February 7th's service will celebrate traditional gospel music and classical music by relatively unknown composers.

Chevalier de Saint-Georges

Known as the "Black Mozart," Chevalier de Saint-Georges (1745-1799) was the first classical composer of African ancestry, as well as an expert violinist, composer, and fencer. The French-trained Saint-Georges lived a colorful life, leading an all-black Republican regiment during the French Revolution, then voyaging to modern-day Haiti to participate in a slave revolt. Two weeks after returning from Haiti, the energetic Saint-Georges began building an orchestra in Paris. He died only a few years later of a neglected ulcer, leaving behind a major body of works, including operas, concertos, and chamber music.



Florence Price

Florence Price was the first female African-American composer to be commissioned by a major orchestra. She received her early training from her mother and had published by the age of 11. At the prestigious New England Conservatory, Price posed as a Mexican to avoid racial discrimination. Her works are celebrated for their individual voice, often incorporating African-American idioms. With numerous awards, festivals, and schools named in her honor, Price has become a household name among musicians.
