Marge Adler, music director, is relied upon by collaborators across North America for her eclectic approach and inventiveness as arranger/keyboardist, and was lauded by Plain Dealer critics as "a treasure with at least three hands." Noted vocalist collaborators include tenor David Cangelosi (Metropolitan Opera), Jill Hayman (*Beauty and the Beast* on Broadway and first national tour of Les Miserables), and bass/baritone Phillip Lamar Boyki (Tony-award nominee for Gershwin's Porgy and Bess on Broadway.) Other notable credits range from Music Director for the Critics' Circle Award-winning Sweeney Todd, to Author/Instigator of the Duelling Divas cabaret revues, to Co-Author and Musical Director for Songs the *Harrigan's Sang* at the Cleveland Play House, to Composer/Arranger/Orchestrator for the musical score for the film *Exact Change*. During Marge's season as Organist for the Cleveland Indians, there were days when she would change hats on I-71 to become Harpsichordist for Bach Festival at Baldwin-Wallace.
