Traits of the Beloved Community, a Working Document

- 1. Recognizes and honors the image of God in every human being
- 2. Recognizes and affirms, not eradicates differences
- 3. Takes the steps necessary to recognize and honor all voices, thereby fostering trust and embracing one another
- 4. Acknowledges limitations, ambiguity, lack of knowledge or understanding; listen and seek to learn
- 5. Speaks the truth in love, resolving conflicts peacefully and compassionately, without physical or verbal violence
- 6. Actively commits to justice through removing unjust systems without destroying people
- 7. Encourages and embraces artistic expressions of faith from diverse perspectives
- 8. Achieves friendship and understanding through negotiation compromise or consensus, considering each circumstance to discern which will be most helpful
- 9. Blends faith and action to generate a commitment to defeating injustice (not forgetting that injustice can also be found within the Church)
- 10. Promotes human rights and creates a just society by meeting the needs of everyone in the community, sharing power, and acknowledging the network of mutuality among all humans
- 11. Fosters dynamic and active spirituality through reliance on Scripture, prayer and corporate worship, recognizing God as dynamic and active in the world
