Traits of the Beloved Community, a Working Document

- 1. Recognizes and honors the image of God in every human being.
- 2. Recognizes and affirms, not eradicates differences
- 3. Takes the steps necessary to recognize and honor all voices, thereby fostering trust and embracing one another

4. Acknowledges limitations, ambiguity, lack of knowledge or understanding; listen and seek to learn

5. Speaks the truth in love, resolving conflicts peacefully and compassionately, without physical or verbal violence

6. Actively commits to justice through removing unjust systems without destroying people.

7. Encourages and embraces artistic expressions of faith from diverse perspectives.

8. Achieves friendship and understanding through negotiation, compromise or consensus, considering each circumstance to discern which will be most helpful.

9. Blends faith and action to generate a commitment to defeating injustice (not forgetting that injustice can also be found within the Church).

10. Promotes human rights and creates a just society by meeting the needs of everyone in the community, sharing power and acknowledging the network of mutuality among all humans.

11. Fosters dynamic and active spirituality through reliance on Scripture, prayer and corporate worship, recognizing God as dynamic and active in the world.
